- Invest energy into social enterprise spaces (i.e. the Brisbane Social Enterprise Hub, maker spaces, regional hubs and collaborative ventures).
- Increase communication through newsletters and social media platforms.
- Develop a new digital membership portal to connect and engage members.

- Reveal the depth of market for SE to advance social procurement.

HOW WE DO THIS



- Promote sector-wide forums and workshops (i.e. regional Summits, Unconference, on-line meetups and workshops).
- Harness a social enterprise specific mentorship program through the Mentor 4 Growth program.
- Seek new funding to support a learning hub for social enterprises pivot and scale.
- Deliver sector-wide responses to change (i.e. COVID 19 and economic conditions).
- Co-creation of content for workshops training and accelerator programs for social enterprises.
- Establish sector development plans for state government.

- Develop member representation on panels and committees to drive systems change.
- Continue to contribute to the national social enterprise dialogue through the Alliance of Social Enterprise of Australia (ASENA).
- Develop strong partnerships with key local, state and national bodies and stakeholders.
- Maintain strong advocacy for the international development of social enterprise through the Social Enterprise World Forum (SEWF) and relationships with other peak bodies.
